1. The Power of _____

Acts 2:1 “When the day of **Pentecost** arrived, they were all together in one place.”

Acts 2:2-3 “And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing **wind**, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³ And divided tongues as of **fire** appeared to them and rested on each one of them.”

Acts 2:2 “...and it filled the entire house where they were sitting...”

3. The Radical _____

Acts 2:6-11 “And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷ And they were amazed and astonished, saying, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹ Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, ¹¹ both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.”

4. A Great Question to _____

Acts 2:12 “And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?”

LOOK IN:

1. How have you experienced the Holy Spirit’s presence in a particular place? Where were you and how could you tell the Spirit was there?
2. How has the Holy Spirit manifested His presence in your own life? How do you feel when the Holy Spirit speaks to you?

3. The crowd and Jerusalem were made up of people from all kinds of different places, just like our own communities are. What factors make relating to people in your community who are different from you difficult or intimidating?
4. How has the Holy Spirit used you to draw attention to God and what He is doing in the world? How have people reacted to you?
5. Has anyone ever dismissed the work of the Spirit in your life? What happened? How has that affected you?
